Cherokee Pride II project builds on the successful Cherokee Pride initiative that brings high-quality, evidence-based English Language instructional services to Stilwell's EL population, while simultaneously expanding and enhancing Cherokee Culture and Cherokee Tsalagi Language courses. Cherokee Pride II will serve grades K-12. Oklahoma State-certified educators recognized by the Cherokee Nation Education Services Department as being fluent in the Tsalagi Language will play a key role in the project.

T365C230005 | Cook Inlet Tribal Council, Inc. | Alaska

The Cultural Connections Continuation project will provide educational services for Alaska Native students in Anchorage, Alaska. Yup'ik and Inupiaq are the home languages of eligible participants who are active Native Language speakers. Project goals aim to develop English language and literacy proficiency among Alaska Native elementary school students; and strengthen the connection to Alaska Native languages and cultures among Alaska Native students in grade K-5.

Box Elder Schools Culture and Language Literacy Program will serve Native American students in grades K-5. Major initiatives of the project include development of a Cree immersion class, education intervention services, monitoring of English and Cree language proficiency, promotion of education equity for underserved students and the development of an advisory council to strengthen community engagement.
