Reminder: Part I of the SY 2009-10 CSPR is Open for Data Corrections, Closes Wednesday 3/16/2011

Part I of the SY 2009-10 CSPR reopened for data corrections on Monday, February 28. If your state has submitted data in ESS since Part I closed in December that should be included in recertification, a managing user needs to create a new version of the CSPR. After the nightly pre-fill refresh, the results of the ESS resubmissions will be populated in your state's CSPR.

So if data corrections are necessary for your state, please make sure you create a new version soon to allow time for the nightly refresh.

Part I will close permanently on Wednesday, March 16 at 5:00 PM EDT. Files to pre-fill the CSPR must be submitted by 5:00 PM EDT the previous day, March 15.

Materials from the March PSC Online Meeting with States - Including Discussion on Reporting SY 2010-11 Assessment Data

March's PSC meeting included a special discussion and poll on potential *EDFacts* reporting options for SY 2010-11 Assessment data. ED presented possible reporting options and ask states for their feedback.

Option 3 - 25.93% (14)

Option 4 - 7.4% (4)

The following is provided to give you some insight into issues being handled by your Partner Support Center (PSC):

New Issues Affecting Multiple SEAs

1. ERS: Multiple states reported that files due on 2/17 do not show as submitted timely in the LEAD015 report, even though they were. Status: This issue was escalated to the

development team and is scheduled to be corrected in a system release by the end of this week (3/11/2011).

2. ESS: Multiple states are seeing inflated Prior Year values in their SY 2010-11 State Agency Edit Report and School Edit Report. Also affects the SY 2009-10 report. Status: Escalated to the development team for resolution.
