The National Evaluation and Technical Assistance Center for the Education of Children and Youth Who Are Neglected, Delinquent or At Risk (NDTAC) is pleased to announce the next event in their series of Webinars (Web-based teleconferences): "Understanding the Consolidated State Performance Report (CSPR) for School Year 2010–11" on Tuesday, October 25th from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. ET.

During the Webinar, the panel will review the collection process for Title I, Part D, with a focus on the 2010–11 school year. John McLaughlin, Title I, Part D, Federal Program Manager, U.S. Department of Education, will discuss the importance of the collection process and highlight the new clarifications for this year's collection. Liann Seiter, NDTAC Research Associate, will provide an overview of the CSPR "basics" and address the common pitfalls and challenges related to Title I, Part D. Along with the presenters, Joel McFarland, ED Facts Management and Program Analyst, U.S. Department of Education, will be available to take questions and discuss any issues that may arise during the Webinar.

The Webinar is intended primarily for those involved in the data collection and reporting process for Title I, Part D, at the State education agency, State agency, and local education agency levels, including Title I, Part D, CSPR, and ED Facts Coordinators. NDTAC encourages State colleagues to participate in the Webinar together. Coordinators also may forward this invitation to others within their State who may benefit from this overview and discussion.

These reports show ED*Facts* Submission System (ESS) Data that will be used to populate your state's SY 2010-11 CSPR and help your state's program office and federal liaisons with these data submissions. You will be able to run the reports and present your CSPR team with data formatted as the data will appear in the CSPR collection tool. These reports can be found in the ED*Facts* Reporting System (ERS) in the "ED*Facts* Reports for CSPR folder" under the ED*Facts* Data Collection.

Note: The report entitled "ESS Submission Status Report for CSPR SY 2009-10 - Part I (CSPR016a)" will be retired. We will be updating LEAD018 to include a prompt selection that will filter LEAD018 by the files required for CSPR Part I and Part II. The final release date for the updated LEAD018 has not yet been determined. PSC will notify states when it is launched.

Reminder: RE Values for CTE Files

ED is in the process of correcting the CTE file specifications (82, 83, 155, 156, and 157) to remove the option for submitting the 5 permitted values for Racial Ethnic data. The data must be submitted using the 7 permitted values.
