The data correction period for Part I of the SY 2010-11 Consolidated State Performance Report closes **TOMORROW**, Friday, March 9, 2012 at 5:00 p.m., EST. All files for pre-fill must be successfully submitted to ESS by 5:00 p.m., EST **TODAY**, Thursday, March 8, 2012.

**NEW! NDTAC Webinar: Proposed Changes to the Title I, Part D, Federal Data Collection**

As many of you are aware, proposed changes to the Consolidated State Performance Report (CSPR) for both SY 2011-12 and SY 2012-13 were released on February 15, 2012. The changes are open for a 60-day comment period. After comments are received, there will be an additional 30-day comment period for the forms as well. This webinar is intended to explain the proposed changes; all formal feedback on the changes must directed to OMB during the comment period.

### ***UPDATE! Submission of SY 2009-10 SIG Baseline Data into ESS***

The ED*Facts* Submission System was recently enabled to accept most of the SY 2009-10 School Improvement Grant (SIG) files that were manually submitted by states last year. These files include: 159, 160, 166 and 167. In order to maximize ED's use of this data, PSC will be submitting those files into ESS beginning February 27. The SIG program office plans to begin analyzing the SY 2009-10 data against the SY 2010-11 data once the baseline data are available in the system.

Beginning today, PSC will be submitting these files on behalf of states. After checking to see if the state has already submitted an updated version of these files for SY 2009-10, analysts will submit the exact file that was e-mailed to PSC around this time last year. If there are format errors, PSC will correct these and resubmit. If there are validation errors, the analyst will send the file back to the ED*Facts* Coordinator to be corrected. This is because it may require a change to the data, and PSC is not authorized to alter state data.

Please let PSC know as soon as possible if you expect to be updating and resubmitting any of these SIG SY 2009-10 data prior to April 30, in which case, PSC will not submit the original baseline files into ESS. If you need to update the SY 2009-10 baseline school-level data for files 139 or 163, please send those files to PSC.

The due date will also be included with the upcoming due dates listed in the weekly PSC broadcasts.
