Reminder: PSC Online Meeting with States for July

The July PSC Online Meeting with States will be held from 3:00 – 4:00 p.m., EDT on Wednesday, July 18, 2012. After a brief update on PSC facts and figures, ED will provide additional information regarding Charter School Reconciliation Reports.

The Department of Education has been working on creating one, master charter school list. In order to create this list, several charter school databases have been compared and reconciled. These databases include the Common Core of Data, National Authorizer Resource database, and the Charter Schools Program Award database. During this reconciliation process, anomalies in the three files were identified and have been presented in a report that will be sent to you on Monday, July 16th. PSC will be hosting its monthly PSC Webinar on July 18th. This webinar will include a “walk-through” segment in which the lead contractor working on the reconciliation will explain how to interpret the report and discuss next steps to fixing the anomalies. We hope both ED Facts Coordinators and Charter School Grantees and Project Directors will be in attendance for this webinar.

Your state’s Charter School Grantees and Project Director has been notified of this meeting in a separate e-mail, but please take this opportunity to contact that person and discuss your state’s approach to this project.

Reminder: 60-Day Notice Published on ESEA Flexibility Data Collection through EDFacts

The 60-day notice for (4860) 1875-NEW "EDFacts Collection of Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) Flexibility Data" was published May 31 in the Federal Register. The proposed collection is focused on data that may be needed to ensure that SEAs receiving ESEA flexibility are continuing to meet the intent and purpose of Title I of ESEA. Data proposed for collection include performance data for flexibility (super) subgroups identified by some states in their flexibility requests; identification of reward schools; state-defined school improvement status; flexibility funds spent; and state interventions used in focus and priority schools.
