This is to advise you of the disposition of the above-referenced complaint that was filed with the U.S. Department of Education (Department), Office for Civil Rights (OCR), on November 26, 2013, against the Lisle Community School District (District), alleging discrimination on the basis of disability. Specifically, the complaint alleges that, in October 2013, the District discriminated against Student A on the basis of disability by failing to implement provisions of her Section 504 Plan.

OCR is responsible for enforcing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), 29 U.S.C. § 794, and its implementing regulation, 34 C.F.R. Part 104, and Title II of the Americans With Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. § 12132, and its implementing regulation, 28 C.F.R. Part 35. Section 504 prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by recipients of Federal financial assistance. Title II prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by public entities. As a recipient of Federal financial assistance from the Department and a public entity, the District is subject to these laws.

In accordance with Section 302 of OCR's *Case Processing Manual*, a complaint may be resolved at any time when, before the conclusion of an investigation, the recipient expresses an interest in resolving the complaint. Prior to the conclusion of OCR's investigation, the District requested to resolve the complaint. Subsequent discussions with the District resulted in the District signing the enclosed Resolution Agreement (Agreement) which, when fully implemented, will resolve the issues raised in the complaint. The provisions of the Agreement are aligned with the complaint allegations and the information obtained to date during our investigation, and are consistent with the applicable regulations. OCR will monitor the District's implementation of the Agreement.
