On February 24, 2010, the U.S. Department of Education (Department), Office for Civil Rights (OCR), received a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of disability by the Westminster College (College), Fulton, Missouri. This letter confirms the voluntary resolution of the above-referenced complaint.

In the complaint, the complainant specifically alleged Westminster Hall, Newnham Hall, Westminster Historic Gymnasium, Reeves Library and Hazel Wing, Champ Auditorium, and the Church of St. Mary, The Virgin, Aldermanbury, on the College's campus are not accessible to persons with mobility impairments.

OCR is responsible for enforcing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), 29 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 794, and its implementing regulation, 34 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) Part 104. Section 504 prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by recipients of Federal financial assistance from the Department.

As a recipient of Federal financial assistance from the Department, the College is subject to Section 504. Additional information about the laws OCR enforces is available on our website at http://www.ed.gov/ocr.

Prior to the completion of OCR's investigation, the College submitted a signed Resolution Agreement (copy enclosed) on February 25, 2015, that, when fully implemented, will address the complaint allegations.

OCR considers the allegations of this complaint resolved effective the date of this letter and will monitor the College's implementation of the Resolution Agreement (Agreement). When OCR concludes the College has fully implemented the terms of the Agreement, OCR will close this complaint. If the College fails to fully implement any of the provisions in the Agreement, OCR may resume OCR's investigation.
