Resolution Agreement University of California, Los Angeles OCR Case No. 09-23-2083

University of California, Los Angeles (the University), without admitting to any violation of law, agrees to implement this Resolution Agreement (Agreement) to resolve the compliance concerns identified by the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR) under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), 29 U.S.C. § 794, and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Title II), 42 U.S.C. §§ 12131-12134, and their implementing regulations in the above-referenced case number.

I. Accessible Seating

- A. The University will provide permanent accessible seating on the east side of Wallis Annenberg Stadium (the Stadium). Specifically, the accessible seating will be placed in close proximity (either in front or directly beside) to the east-side bleachers in the Stadium. The accessible seating will be identified with appropriate signage and markings. The accessible seating will meet the technical requirements of Sections 221.2.1.1 and 802 of the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design (2010 Standards).
- B. The University will ensure that there is an accessible path of travel to and from the accessible seating on the east side of the Stadium that is consistent with Section 206 and Chapter 4 of the 2010 Standards.

II. Monitoring and Reporting

- A. By November 3, 2023, the University will submit a proposed plan to OCR for review and approval regarding the requirements of Section I. The proposed plan will include a map indicating the location(s) of the accessible seating, the dimensions of the seating area and wheelchair accessible spaces within the area, and information relating to the identification and marking of the accessible seating area(s).
- B. By May 3, 2024, the University will submit a report to OCR, along with supporting documentation, confirming that the items identified in Section I are completed and accessible to individuals with disabilities. Documentation will include photographs and verification that the items comply with the relevant accessibility standards.

The University understands that by signing the Agreement, it agrees to provide data and other information in a timely manner in accordance with the reporting requirements of the resolution agreement. Further, the University understands that during the monitoring of the Agreement, if necessary, OCR may visit the University, interview staff and students, and request such additional reports or data as are necessary for OCR to determine whether the University has fulfilled the terms and obligations of the Agreement. Upon the University's satisfaction of the commitments made under the Agreement, OCR will close the case.

The University understands and acknowledges that OCR may initiate proceedings to enforce the
specific terms and obligations of the Agreement and/or the applicable statute(s) and regulation(s).
Before initiating such proceedings, OCR will give the University written notice of the alleged
breach and sixty (60) calendar days to cure the alleged breach.
