Dear Superintendent Beers:

This is to inform you that the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR) is discontinuing its investigation of the above-referenced discrimination complaint against Dayton School District 8. Specifically, the complaint alleged that there are an insufficient number of designated accessible parking spaces at XXXXXXXX and that the designated accessible parking spaces that are available lack appropriate signage.

OCR accepted this complaint for resolution under the authority of section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1972 and title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and their implementing regulations.

The district has agreed to take the actions set forth in the enclosed Voluntary Resolution Agreement (agreement), which, when fully implemented, will resolve the issue raised by the complaint. OCR will monitor the implementation of the agreement and will close the complaint when OCR determines that the terms of the agreement have been satisfied. The first report under the agreement is due by March 15, 2014.
