



To investigate this complaint, OCR interviewed the Complainant and reviewed the preliminary documents submitted by the District.

The Complainant told OCR that the Student is a qualified individual with a disability with a diagnosis of xxxxxxxxxxx xxxxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxx xxxxxxxx. The Complainant provided OCR with a copy of the Student's xxxxxxxx xxx xxxxx dated xxx xxx xxxxx that provided the Student with xxxxx xxx x xxxxx (extended time) for quizzes and tests and allowed him xx xxx x xxxxxxx xxxxxx xx xxxxxxxxxxx xxxxxx xxx xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx. The Complainant told OCR that: xx xxx xxxxxxx xxx xxx xxxxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxx xxxxx xx xxx xxxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxx quizzes on xxx xxx xxxxxx xxx xxx xxx xxxxxxx and received a x on both quizzes; 2) the Student did not receive xxxxxxxxxxx xxxxx in xxx xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx course throughout the 3rd and 4th quarters; and 3) that the xxxxxx class lacked accountability with respect to ensuring that the Student xxxxxxxxxxx xxx xxxxx because the Student was still xxxxxxxxxxx xxx classes.

The District provided OCR with a copy of one of the Student's xxxxxxx xxx xxxxxxx dated xxxxxxxxxxx xxx xxxxx. According to this plan, the Student was to receive similar services as were identified in his xxx xxx xxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxx xxx xxxxx provided by the Complainant. According to the xxxxxxxxxxx xxx xxxxxx xxxxxx the Student was to receive xxxxxxxxxxx xxxxx xxxxx xxxxxx on tests and quizzes and was allowed to use an xxxxx in class. The District also provided OCR with the Student's class schedule, showing that he was enrolled in xxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxxxxxx xxx xxxxxxx class, and a xxxxxxxxxxxxxxx class.

Under the regulation implementing Section 504, at 34 C.F.R. § 104.33, school districts are required to provide a free appropriate public education (FAPE) to qualified students with disabilities. Such an education consists of regular or special education and related aids and services designed to meet the individual educational needs of students with disabilities as adequately as the needs of students without disabilities are met.

### Voluntary Resolution

Before the conclusion of OCR's investigation, the District expressed interest in voluntarily resolving this complaint pursuant to Section 302 of OCR's Case Processing Manual (CPM). The CPM provides that a complaint may be resolved before the conclusion of an OCR investigation if a recipient asks to resolve the complaint and signs a resolution agreement that addresses the complaint allegations. Such a request does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of the District, nor does it constitute a determination by OCR that the District has violated any of the laws that OCR enforces. The provisions of the resolution agreement are to be aligned with the complaint allegations or the information obtained during the investigation and consistent with applicable regulations.

Under the terms of the voluntary agreement signed by the District (the Agreement), the District will reconvene the Student's xxx xxxxx (Team) to determine whether compensatory education is necessary to compensate the Student for the District's alleged

failure to implement his xxxxxxxx xxx xxxxx and provide xxx with FAPE. The Team will determine what, if any, compensatory education or other remedial services the Student may be entitled to receive. If the team determines that the Student is entitled to compensatory education or other remedial services, the District will develop a written plan for providing the Student with the compensatory education or other remedial services deemed necessary. The plan will identify the nature and amount of the services to be provided at no cost to the Student's parents, by whom, and when, and will become part of the Student's xxxxxxxx xxx xxxxx xx xxxxx. The Student's parents will be invited to participate in the Team meetings. If they are unable to attend, the District will provide the parents with a meaningful opportunity to provide input, written notice of any determinations made, and notice of the procedural safeguards available to them under Section 504, including their right to challenge such determinations through an impartial due process hearing should they disagree. Additionally, the agreement requires the District to provide training by a competent authority on Section 504 on the District's obligations to students with disabilities under Section 504, to all of its administrators and other District staff who have responsibilities for implementing portions of students' Section 504 plans or IEPs.

In light of the signed Agreement, which is enclosed, OCR finds that this complaint is resolved, and OCR is closing its investigation as of the date of this letter. OCR will, however, monitor the District's implementation of the Agreement. Should the District fail to fully implement the Agreement, OCR will reopen the complaint and resume its investigation of the complaint allegations.

Please be advised that the District may not harass, coerce, intimidate, or discriminate against any individual because he or she has filed a complaint or participated in the complaint resolution process. If this happens, the complainant may file another complaint alleging such treatment. A complainant may have the right to file a private suit in Federal court, whether or not OCR finds a violation.

We appreciate the cooperation of the District during the preliminary investigation and resolution of this complaint.
