

**Grosse Pointe Public Schools
Resolution Agreement
OCR Docket #15-18-1151**

Grosse Pointe Public Schools (the District) voluntarily submits this Resolution Agreement (Agreement) to the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR), for the purpose of resolving the above-referenced complaint and ensuring compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. § 794, and its implementing regulation, 34 C.F.R. Part 104, and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. § 12131 *et seq.*, and its implementing regulation, 28 C.F.R. Part 35. The District is not making any admission of liability by entering into this Agreement.

The District agrees to take the following actions:

By July 23, 2018, the District will invite the Student's parents to re-enroll him in the District and state that, should the Student's parents re-enroll him in the District, the District will convene the Student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) team, including the Student's parents, to determine if and/or what compensatory education or other remedial services the Student requires for the time period XXXXXX XX XXXX through XXXXXX XX XXXX, for any failure to provide the Student with XXXXX XXXX in XXXXXX XX XXXX. If there is agreement to provide compensatory education, the group will develop a written plan for providing the Student with the compensatory education or other remedial services deemed necessary, which plan will identify the nature and amount of the services to be provided at no cost to the Student's parents, by whom, and when, and will become part of the Student's IEP. The District will provide the Student's parents with a meaningful opportunity to provide input into these determinations, notice of the determinations made, and notice of the procedural safeguards available to them under 34 C.F.R. § 104.36, including their right to challenge such determinations through an impartial due process hearing should they disagree.

Reporting Requirements

By July 23, 2018, the District will submit to OCR a copy of the invitation to the Student's parents pursuant to Action Item 1 above.

By September 11, 2018, the District will submit to OCR documentation showing implementation of Action Item 1 above, including a copy of any meeting minutes, a copy of any plan developed for the Student, documentation of any input provided by the Student's parents and showing that procedural safeguards were provided to them, and any other documentation relevant to the determinations reached in accordance with Action Item 1 above. The District will also provide documentation to OCR of the dates, times, and locations that any compensatory education or other remedial services, if any, were provided to the Student, including the name(s) and title(s) of the service provider(s) and the scheduled dates, times, and locations that any compensatory education or other remedial services will be provided to the Student. Should the District

determine that no compensatory education or other remedial services were necessary, the District will provide a written explanation of the reasons for that determination, along with any supporting documentation. OCR will review the documentation submitted to ensure that the District met the procedural requirements of the regulation implementing Section 504, at 34 C.F.R. §§ 104.34, 104.35 and 104.36, in making these determinations. If the Student’s parents did not accept the District’s invitation to re-enroll him prior to September 4, 2018, the District will submit a signed letter to OCR stating this.

General Requirements

The District understands that, by signing this Agreement, it agrees to provide data and other information in a timely manner in accordance with the reporting requirements of the Agreement. Further, the District understands that during the monitoring of this Agreement, if necessary, OCR may visit the District, interview staff and students, and request such additional reports or data as are necessary for OCR to determine whether the District has fulfilled the terms of the Agreement. Upon the District’s satisfaction of the commitments made under the Agreement, OCR will close the case.

The District understands and acknowledges that OCR may initiate administrative enforcement or judicial proceedings to enforce the specific terms and obligations of the Agreement. Before initiating administrative enforcement (34 C.F.R. §§ 100.9, 100.10) or judicial proceedings to enforce the Agreement, OCR will give the District written notice of the alleged breach and sixty (60) calendar days to cure the alleged breach.

The Agreement will become effective immediately upon the signature of the District’s representative below.
