Dear President Jenkins:

The Office for Civil Rights of the Department of Education (OCR/ED) is in the process of resolving a number of pending requests for religious exemption from Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. OCR recently reviewed your institution's request and determined that we need further information to make a decision to grant an exemption.

On March 25, 1985, OCR forwarded a request for more information to Alabama Lutheran Junior College specifying that the request letter did not provide sufficient information for OCR to make a determination. There was insufficient information regarding the religious organization that controls your institution, the religious tenets of the controlling organization, and the religious tenets which conflict with the regulation. OCR received no response to this initial request for more information and issued a second request on July 3, 1985. OCR's second request letter indicated that if we did not hear from you within 30 days, we would assume that Alabama Lutheran Junior College no longer had need of a religious exemption to the Title IX regulation.

OCR has not received a response to either request for information. We are assuming that your institution no longer desires a religious exemption. Therefore, OCR has closed your request file. If you determine in the future that your institution requires a religious exemption from Title IX, you will need to submit a new request letter to the Atlanta Regional Office for Civil Rights.
