Dear President Lemley:

The Office for Civil Rights of the Department of Education (OCR/ED) is in the process of resolving a number of pending requests for religious exemption from Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. OCR recently reviewed your request and determined that we need further information to make a decision to grant an exemption.

- On June 7, 1985, OCR forwarded a request for more information to Lubbock Christian College, specifying that your institution's letter did not provide sufficient information for OCR to make a determination. There was insufficient information regarding the religious tenets followed by your institution that conflict with specific sections of the Title IX regulation. OCR received no response to this initial request for more information and issued a second request on July 18, 1985. OCR's second request letter indicated that if we did not hear from you within 30 days, we would assume that Lubbock Christian College no longer had need of a religious exemption to the Title IX regulation.

OCR has not received a response to either request for information. We are assuming that your institution no longer desires a religious exemption. Therefore, OCR has closed your request file. If you determine in the future that your institution requires a religious exemption from Title IX, you will need to submit a new request letter to:
