

# Fact Sheet: Department of Education Announces State by State American Rescue Plan Funding and HEERF grants for Colleges and Universities

Today, the Department of Education announced the final \$198 million in additional grants under the American Rescue Plan – one of the largest one-time infusions of funding ever provided to the nation’s colleges and universities. This fact sheet includes an updated table of state-by-state awards for colleges and universities provided in the President’s American Rescue Plan and the total received under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) to date.
