for Fiscal Year (FY) 2008

Attached are the estimated amounts each State will be awarded for FY 2008 under the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA), Title II of the Workforce Investment Act<sup>1</sup>. These funds will become available July 1, 2008.

The second column of the attached table shows the estimated award amounts for the AEFLA State grant program. Section 211(a) of AEFLA requires 1.72 percent of the total FY 2008 appropriation to be reserved for incentive grants for qualifying States. Additional funds are reserved by section 211(e) of AEFLA for a competition for outlying areas and by hold harmless provisions set out in section 211(f) for Palau. The remaining funds are distributed to States using the formula described in section 211.

These FY 2008 funds include a 1.747 percent across-the-board rescission required by section 128 of Division G of the *Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2008*<sup>2</sup>. The English Literacy/Civics (EL/C) amount of \$67,896,000, which the *Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2008* reserves for integrated English literacy and civics education services to immigrants and other limited English proficient populations, is also affected by the rescission. The FY 2008 appropriations statute allocates 65 percent of EL/C funds to States based on a State's absolute need. This is determined by calculating each State's share of a 10-year average of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) data for immigrants admitted for legal permanent residence for the 10 most recent years. The appropriations statute allots 35 percent to States that experienced growth measured by the average of the three most recent years for which USCIS data for immigrants admitted for legal permanent residence are available. Every State is allocated a minimum of \$60,000 for EL/C. The most recent year for which legal immigration data are available is 2006.
