RE: Estimated Adult Education State Award Amounts
for Fiscal Year (FY) 2011

I am pleased to provide you with the estimated amount each State will be awarded for FY 2011 under the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA). These funds will become available July 1, 2011.

The second column of the attached table shows the estimated award amounts for the State grant program. As in previous years, 1.72 percent of the total FY 2011 appropriation for AEFLA is reserved for incentive grants for qualifying States. Additional funds are reserved by section 211(e) of AEFLA for the competition for outlying areas, and by the hold harmless provisions set out in section 211 (f) for Palau. The remaining funds are distributed to States using the formula described in section 211.

Please note that the FY 2011 funds include a .2% across-the-board rescission, based on the Department of Defense and Full Year Continuing Appropriations Act of 2011¹. The EL/Civics amount, which the Department of Defense and Full Year Continuing Appropriations Act of 2011 reserves for integrated English literacy and civics education services to immigrants and other limited English proficient populations, is also affected by the rescission. As in past years for EL/Civics, the FY 2011 appropriations statute allocates 65 percent of these funds to States based on a State's absolute need as determined by calculating each State's share of a 10-year average of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) data for immigrants admitted for legal permanent residence for the 10 most recent years, and 35 percent to States that experienced growth as measured by the average of the 3 most recent years for which USCIS data for immigrants admitted for legal permanent residence are available. Every State is allocated a minimum of \$60,000. The most recent year for which legal immigration data are available is 2009.
