**RE:** Estimated Adult Education State Award Allocations for  
Fiscal Year (FY) 2013

Attached are the estimated amounts each State will be awarded for FY 2013 under the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA), Title II of the Workforce Investment Act. These funds will become available July 1, 2013.

The second column of the attached table shows the estimated award amounts for the AEFLA State grant program. Section 211 (a) of AEFLA requires 1.72 percent of the total FY 2013 appropriation to be reserved for incentive grants for qualifying States. Additional funds are reserved by section 211 (e) of AEFLA for a competition for Outlying Areas. The remaining funds are distributed to States using the formula described in section 211.

The Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act of 2013<sup>1</sup> provides \$483,259,011 for adult education formula grants to States. The English Literacy/Civics (EL/Civics) amount, which the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act of 2013 reserves for integrated English literacy and civics education services to immigrants and other limited English proficient populations, is \$70,811,239. As in past years for EL/Civics, the FY 2013 appropriations statute allocates 65 percent of EL/Civics funds to States based on a State's absolute need. This is determined by calculating each State's share of a 10-year average of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services data for immigrants admitted for legal permanent residence for the 10 most recent years. The appropriation statute also allocates 35 percent to States that experienced growth as measured by the average of the three most recent years for which the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services data for immigrants admitted for legal permanent residence are available. Every State is allocated a minimum of \$60,000 for EL/Civics. The most recent year for which legal immigration data are available is 2012.
