PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

A full-year 2018 appropriation for this account was not enacted at the time the budget was prepared; therefore, the budget assumes this account is operating under the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2018 (Division D of P.L. 115–56, as amended). The amounts included for 2018 reflect the annualized level provided by the continuing resolution.

Between 1950 and 1993, the College Housing Loans, Higher Education Facilities Loans, and College Housing and Academic Facilities Loans programs (CHAFL) helped to ensure that postsecondary institutions were able to make the capital improvements they needed to maintain and increase their ability to provide a high-quality education. P. L. 104-19 repealed the programs' authority to subsidize gross loan obligations after 1994; since that time, the Administration's role has been to manage the outstanding loans.

FY 2019 BUDGET REQUEST

For fiscal year 2019, the Administration requests \$448,000 for Federal administration of the facilities loans program, \$6 thousand more than the 2018 annualized Continuing Resolution level. Funding levels for the past 5 fiscal years were:
