Information on how to make a FOIA Request and on how to make a Privacy Act request is available from the ED FOIA website: http://www.ed.gov/policy/gen/leg/foia/foiatoc.html Responsive records are released in their entirety unless release is precluded on the basis of nine statutory exemptions, as specified in the FOIA. In general, as a regulatory agency, some investigative records or portions of records are not released. In addition, if records are part of an ongoing investigation or involved with litigation they may not be released or they may be partially released. Personally identifiable information is also not released to anyone except to the individual to whom it applies. Certain information contained in grants and contracts is withheld such as non-federal funding amounts and sources, business proposals, and technical information that is unique to the submitter and falls within protected business information.

- c. **Calendar Day** Every day shown on a calendar. A 24-hour period beginning at 12:01 a.m. and ending at 12:00 p.m. midnight.
- d. **Fees** an agency will charge processing fees based on how the documents will be used and not on the category of the FOIA requester. All fees allowed will be charged to the first requester, when there are multiple requesters for the same documents, and, unless waived, all subsequent requesters will be charged duplication and special services fees only. If a fee is not allowed by statute or regulation to be charged to the first requester, the fee cannot be passed on to the next subsequent requester.

- e. **First-In-First-Out** (**FIFO**) **Processing Policy** an agency will process requests in the order in which requests are received consistent with a multi-track processing system and reasonable allocation of processing resources available for each track and the FOIA program of the agency.
- f. **FOIA/PA Request** a FOIA request is generally a request or access to records concerning a third party, an organization, or a particular topic of interest. A Privacy Act request is a request for records concerning oneself; such requests are also treated as FOIA requests. (All requests for access to records, regardless of which law is cited by the requester, are included in this report.)
- g. **Glomar Response** a glomar response neither confirms nor denies the existence or non-existence of responsive records to a request in order to protect law enforcement, privacy, or other appropriate interests.
- h. **Initial Denial Authority** agency official who is delegated the authority to make release determinations of documents and information contained in documents requested under the FOIA on behalf of the agency.
- i. **Initial Request** a request to a federal agency for access to records under the Freedom of Information Act.
- j. **Perjury Statement** a signed (notarization is not required) statement executed under the penalty of law, usually associated with a request for the personal records of the requester, attesting that they are the individual who they say they are.
- k. **Proper Request** a request that fits the definition of a FOIA request: reasonably describes the agency records being sought and cites a willingness to pay assessable fees or justifies the granting of a fee waiver. Proper requests do not use federal government resources in making the request federal government requests for agency documents for official purposes are not FOIA requests.
- 1. **Reasonably Described** a request is reasonably described if it enables a professional agency employee familiar with the subject area to locate the record with a reasonable amount of effort. An appeal is reasonably described if it adequately describes the action taken by the agency regarding the request and the basis on why the action is not in compliance with the statute or agency regulation.
- m. **Referral** transferring a FOIA request and/or document(s) that are under another agency's purview to another entity for processing. This also includes redirecting a requester to the appropriate agency instead of referring the request.
- n. **Release** an agency decision to disclose all records in full in response to a FOIA request. This sometimes is referred to as a "grant."

- o. **Remanded** a request that is returned to the initial denial authority for reconsideration of their release determination and further processing.
- p. **Request Disposition** an agency determination to take one of four actions on requests for records:
 - i. Responsive records are released in full.
 - ii. Responsive records are released in part because some of the information in the requested records is determined by the agency to be exempt under one or more of the FOIA's exemptions.
 - iii. Responsive records are denied in full because all of the information in the requested records is determined by the agency to be exempt under one or more of the FOIA exemptions.
 - iv. Determined by the agency not to process for other procedural reasons:
 - (1) No Records After a thorough search of agency records, no records were found to be responsive to the FOIA request or within the scope of the FOIA request.
 - (2) Duplicate Request The request is a duplicate of a previously submitted request by the same requester or organization represented by the requester.
 - (3) Fee Related Request is not processed because there were fee issues. For example, the requester was not willing to pay assessable FOIA processing fees or the requester had delinquent fees from previous FOIA requests.
 - (4) Request Withdrawn Requester withdraws their request.
 - (5) Not Reasonably Described sufficient information has not been provided for a professional agency employee familiar with the subject area to locate the record with a reasonable amount of effort.
 - (6) Not a Proper Request the requester is asking questions posing as a FOIA request or a response would require the agency to create a record.
 - (7) Not an Agency Record Documents requested in a FOIA request that are not maintained, or possibly originated, by the Department or its components.
 - (8) Referred to an Appropriate Agency request for records that are not held by a Department agency and are more likely the documents of some other federal agency other than the Department.
- q. **Working Days** days except Saturdays, Sundays, and Federally recognized public holidays.
- **2.** Basic Terms Used in This Report and in FOIA Training:
 - a. **Administrative Appeal** a request to a federal agency asking that it review at a higher administrative level a FOIA determination made by the agency at the initial request level.
 - b. **Average Number** the number obtained by dividing the sum of a group of numbers by the quantity of numbers in the group. For example, of 3, 7, and 14, the average number is 8.

- c. **Backlog** the number of requests or administrative appeals that are pending at an agency at the end of the fiscal year that are beyond the statutory time period for a response.
- d. **Component** for agencies that process requests on a decentralized basis, a component is an entity, also sometimes referred to as an office, division, bureau, center, or directorate, within the agency that processes FOIA requests. The FOIA now requires that agencies include in their Annual FOIA Report data for both the agency overall and for each principal component of the agency.
- e. **Consultation** the procedure whereby the agency responding to a FOIA request first forwards a record to another agency for its review because that other agency has an interest in the document. Once the agency in receipt of the consultation finishes its review of the record, it responds back to the agency that forwarded it. That agency, in turn, will then respond to the FOIA requester.
- f. **Exemption 3 Statute** a federal statute that exempts information from disclosure and which the agency relies on to withhold information under subsection (b)(3) of the FOIA.
- g. **FOIA Request** a FOIA request is generally a request to a federal agency for access to records concerning another person (i.e., a third-party request) or concerning an organization or a particular topic of interest. FOIA requests also include requests made by requesters seeking records concerning themselves (i.e., first-party requests) when those requesters are not subject to the Privacy Act, such as non-U.S. citizens. Moreover, because all first-party requesters should be afforded the benefit of both the access provisions of the FOIA as well as those of the Privacy Act, FOIA requests also include any first-party requests where an agency determines that it must search beyond its Privacy Act systems of records or where a Privacy Act exemption applies, and the agency looks to FOIA to afford the greatest possible access. All requests that require the agency to use the FOIA in responding to the requester are included in this report. Additionally, a FOIA request includes records referred to the agency for processing and direct response to the requester. It does not, however, include records for which the agency has received a consultation from another agency. (Consultations are reported separately in Section XII of this report.)
- h. **Full Grant** an agency determination to disclose all records in full in response to a FOIA request.
- Full Denial an agency determination not to release any records in response to a
 FOIA request because the records are exempt in their entireties under one or more of
 the FOIA exemptions or because of a procedural reason such as when no records
 could be located.
- j. **Median Number** the middle, not average, number. For example, of 3, 7, and 14, the median number is 7.

- k. **Multi-track Processing** a system in which simple requests requiring relatively minimal review are placed in one processing track and more voluminous and complex requests are placed in one or more other tracks. Requests granted expedited processing are placed in yet another track. Requests in each track are processed on a first-in/first-out basis. The tracks are:
 - i. **Expedited Processing** an agency will process a FOIA request on an expedited basis when a requester satisfies the requirements for expedited processing as set forth in the statute and in agency regulations.
 - ii. **Simple Request** a FOIA request that an agency using multi-track processing places in its fastest (non-expedited) track based on the low volume and/or simplicity of records requested.
 - iii. **Complex Request** a FOIA request that an agency using multi-track processing places in a slower track based on the high volume and/or complexity of records requested.
- 1. **Partial Grant / Partial Denial** in response to a FOIA request, an agency determination to disclose portions of the records and to withhold other portions that are exempt under the FOIA, or to otherwise deny a portion of the request for a procedural reason.
- m. **Pending Request or Pending Administrative Appeal** a request or administrative appeal for which an agency has not taken final action in all respects.
- n. **Perfected Request** a request for records that reasonably describes such records and is made in accordance with published rules stating the time, place, fees (if any), and procedures to be followed.
- o. **Processed Request or Processed Administrative Appeal** action on the request or the appeal in all respects has been completed.
- p. **Range in Number of Days** the lowest and highest number of days to process requests or administrative appeals.
- q. **Time Limits** the time period in the statute for an agency to respond to a FOIA request (ordinarily twenty working days from receipt of a perfected FOIA request).
- **3.** The Nine FOIA Exemptions:
 - a. **Exemption 1**: classified national defense and foreign relations information
 - b. **Exemption 2**: internal agency rules and practices
 - c. **Exemption 3**: information that is prohibited from disclosure by another federal law
 - d. Exemption 4: trade secrets and other confidential business information
 - e. **Exemption 5**: inter-agency or intra-agency communications that are protected by legal privileges
 - f. **Exemption 6**: information involving matters of personal privacy

- g. Exemption 7: records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, to the extent that the production of those records (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual
- h. **Exemption 8**: information relating to the supervision of financial institutions
- i. **Exemption 9**: geological information on wells

F. Discussion of Other Department of Education FOIA Activities

The Freedom of Information Act Service Center

The Open Government Directive

The guiding principle underlying the President's FOIA Memorandum and the Attorney General's FOIA Guidelines is the presumption of openness. The Department and the FOIA Service Center (FSC), in addition to publicizing the presumption of openness within the FOIA processing cadre of ___ full time and ___ full-time-equivalent staff, took many steps in FY 2010 to ensure a presumption of openness was applied to all decisions involving the FOIA by:

- 1) Implementing a process for proactive (in advance of a FOIA request) and discretionary (using a no-foreseeable-harm determination threshold) release of records. Annually, the Department receives more than 700 requests for contracts, grant applications, and information about federally funded programs. The FSC staff is working with several program offices; such as the Office of Postsecondary Education (OPE) and the Office of English Language Acquisition (OELA) to identify and post these types of documents in the FOIA e-Reading Room.
- 2) Providing e-Reading Room visitors access to common FOIA requested documents and also hyperlinks directly to program offices to make it easier for the public to locate the most recent copy of the document they are seeking without needing to submit a FOIA request.
- 3) Developing a FOIA Training Curriculum with modules focused on the various groups of employees and their specific responsibility for administering the FOIA. The first module in the series provides basic information about the FOIA to new employees upon entry, and to all Department employees, electronically, on an annual basis.
- 4) Streamlining the Intake Process to quickly identify, process, and close requests within the first 20 workdays after receipt. This includes working with requesters to quickly help them perfect their request by providing additional information regarding the scope of their request as well as resolving fee issues and special handling, and then assigning their request to the appropriate program offices. The FSC also has implemented new procedures and emphasis to rapidly review and complete cases once they have been returned to the FSC by the program.

Proactive Disclosures

- 1) Worked closely with the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education on the 36 submissions (35 states and the District of Columbia) for Race To The Top grants that were redacted and uploaded to the website (http://www2.ed.gov/programs/racetothetop/phase2-applications/index.html). The total number of pages posted in anticipation of received FOIA requests was 10,157 pages. The FOIA Electronic Reading Room on the web also has been linked to the 36 applications to make it easier for requesters to locate the documents.
- 2) Worked with the Institute of Education Sciences to process the 20 Statewide Longitudinal Data Systems (SLDS) grants that were redacted and uploaded to the SLDS website (http://nces.ed.gov/programs/slds/stateinfo.asp) and the documents were also linked to the FOIA Electronic Reading Room on the web.

Processing Improvements

- 1) The FOIA Service Center implemented the testing phase of the latest version of the web-based electronic FOIA processing system, FOIAXpress, and anticipates completing testing and rolling out the upgraded version in the fourth quarter.
- 2) The Department finalized and published in the Federal Register new regulations for implementing and carrying out the FOIA program. In addition to reflecting changes required by the FOIA Amendments of 1987, the Electronic FOIA Act of 1996, and the OPEN Government Act of 2007; the new regulations also incorporated the President's January 21, 2009, Memorandum of FOIA and the Attorney General's FOIA Guidance memorandum of March 19, 2009. The new regulations became effective on July 14, 2010.

Training and Outreach

1) The FOIA Service Center staff contracted with the USDA graduate school to create a 1-day FOIA training seminar for Department program FOIA Coordinators and their supervisors. The training seminar was conducted on September 7, 2010, for more than 55 employees in attendance and broadcast out (through the Department's MediaSite system) to the FOIA staff at 12 regional offices across the country. The topics included elements of a request, fees, response times, appeals, and each of the exemptions. Based on participation by attendees and the return of course evaluation forms by 60% of attendees; the course was well received and all of the respondents felt that the topics selected and presented met all of their expectations and training needs.
