<p>Indicator 7:</p> <p>OSEP's October 5, 2005 FFY 2003 APR response letter accepted the State's plan to ensure compliance with the 45-day timeline requirements in 34 CFR §§ 303.321(e)(2), 303.322(e)(1) and 303.342(a) and required a progress report in the SPP and a final progress report with data demonstrating compliance due 30 days following one year from the date of OSEP's letter (November 5, 2006).</p>	<p>In the SPP, page 22, Colorado provided a report regarding its progress in ensuring compliance with Part C's 45-day timeline requirements. Colorado provided extensive improvement activities, including systemic procedures to support compliance.</p>	<p>Colorado indicated it did not submit data that was collected on or after December 2005, and will not be ready to report until February 2006.</p> <p>December 1, 2005 is the first time that Colorado will have data on the <i>initial IFSP meeting timeline in the database</i>; previously the State collected data on the completion of the IFSP within 45-days.</p>	<p>Colorado's final progress report demonstrating compliance with this requirement, which was due by November 5, 2006 may be submitted with the State's FFY 2005 APR due on February 1, 2007. Failure to demonstrate compliance at that time may affect OSEP's determination of the State's status under section 616(d) of the IDEA.</p>
<p>Indicator 8:</p> <p>8B: OSEP's October 2005 letter also required Colorado to submit in the SPP, baseline data for the notification of LEAs of children potentially eligible for Part B.</p> <p>8C: OSEP's October 5, 2005 FFY 2003 APR response letter accepted the State's plan to ensure compliance with the 90-day transition conference under 34 CFR §303.148(b)(2)(i) and required a progress report in the SPP and a final progress report with data demonstrating compliance due 30 days following one year from the date of OSEP's letter (November 5, 2006).</p>	<p>8B and 8C: On page 26 of the SPP, Colorado submitted a progress report regarding the 90-day transition conference and that notification of LEAs occurred for all children potentially eligible for Part B. Colorado reported that 95% of all children exiting Part C, including those children eligible for Part B, had a documented transition plan and a 90-day transition conference. Colorado also reported the reasons for the 5% that were not timely.</p>	<p>8B and 8C: Colorado provided updated data demonstrating correction of noncompliance regarding the transition planning timelines at 34 CFR §303.148(b)(2)(i) and submitted required baseline data for LEA notification (that indicated 100% compliance).</p>	<p>No further action required. OSEP looks forward to Colorado's data in Indicator 8 in the State's FFY 2005 APR due on February 1, 2007.</p>
