Participate in quarterly statewide management meetings.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>OSEP's June 6, 2008 FFY 2006 SPP/APR response table required the State to demonstrate in the FFY 2007 APR, due February 2, 2009, that the uncorrected noncompliance from FFYs 2004 and 2005 was corrected.
