[Compliance Indicator]</p>	<p>American Samoa’s FFY 2010 reported data for this indicator are 100%. American Samoa’s FFY 2009 data for this indicator were not valid and reliable. Therefore, OSEP could not determine whether there was progress or slippage. American Samoa met its target of 100%.</p> <p>American Samoa reported that all six of its findings of noncompliance identified in FFY 2009 for this indicator were corrected in a timely manner. American Samoa also reported that the three findings of noncompliance identified in FFY 2007 for this indicator were corrected.</p> <p>The timely service provision requirements of this indicator are the subject of Special Conditions that were attached to American Samoa’s FFY 2011 IDEA Part C grant award letter dated July 1, 2011. American Samoa was required to demonstrate compliance with the timely service provision requirements under IDEA Part C to OSEP by February 1, 2012 in two progress reports due on September 30, 2011 and December 31, 2011. American Samoa provided the required two progress reports in a timely manner with updated data for the FFY 2011 period indicating 100% compliance. OSEP is lifting American Samoa’s FFY 2011 Special Conditions and looks forward to reviewing American Samoa’s FFY 2011 data under this indicator in the FFY 2011 APR.</p> <p>American Samoa was identified as being in need of assistance for two consecutive years based on the State’s FFY 2008 and FFY 2009 APRs, was advised of available technical assistance, and was required to report, with the FFY 2010 APR, on: (1) the technical assistance sources from which American Samoa received assistance; and (2) the actions the State took as a result of that technical assistance.
