Dear Commissioner Sablan:

Thank you for the timely submission of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands' (CNMI) Federal fiscal year (FFY) 2010 Annual Performance Report (APR) and revised State Performance Plan (SPP) under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

The Department has determined that, under IDEA sections 616(d)(2)(A)(i) and 642, CNMI meets the requirements of Part C of IDEA. The Department's determination is based on the totality of CNMI's data and information, including CNMI's FFY 2010 APR and revised SPP (including targets and improvement activities for each year through FFY 2012), other CNMI-reported data, and other publicly available information. See the enclosure entitled "How the Department Made Determinations under Section 616(d) and 642 of the IDEA in 2012: Part C" for further details.

Specific factors affecting the determination made by the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) that CNMI meets requirements under IDEA sections 616(d) and 642 include that: (1) CNMI provided valid and reliable FFY 2010 data reflecting the measurement for each indicator; and (2) CNMI reported high levels of compliance or correction of previously identified findings of noncompliance for Indicators 1, 7, 8A, 8B, 8C, 9, 10, 11, and 14. We commend CNMI for its performance.

The enclosed table provides OSEP's analysis of CNMI's FFY 2010 APR and revised SPP and identifies, by indicator, OSEP's review of any revisions CNMI made to its targets, improvement activities (timelines and resources) and baseline data in CNMI's SPP. The table also identifies, by indicator: (1) CNMI's reported FFY 2010 data; (2) whether such data met CNMI's FFY 2010 targets and reflect progress or slippage from the prior year's data; and (3) whether CNMI corrected findings of noncompliance.

As you know, pursuant to IDEA sections 616(b)(2)(C)(ii)(I) and 642, State lead agencies must report annually to the public on the performance of each early intervention services program (EIS program) located in the State on the targets in the SPP. Pursuant to 34 CFR §303.702(b)(1)(A) in the final Part C regulations published on September 28, 2011, beginning with its reporting on the FFY 2011 performance of the EIS programs in 2013, States must report to the public by June 1. Because your jurisdiction is a unitary entity (i.e., the State lead agency is the only EIS program) you may meet this public reporting requirement by posting your FFY 2010 APR on CNMI's Web site and making it available to the public, consistent with IDEA sections 616(d)(2)(C)(ii)(I) and 642. 
