INDICATOR 1: VIDH reported that it did not identify any findings of noncompliance in FFY 2010 for this indicator. VIDH explained that it did not identify any findings of noncompliance based on 11 instances of noncompliance reflected in the FFY 2010 data, because it verified correction of all of those instances of noncompliance, in a manner consistent with OSEP Memo 09-02, prior to the issuance of findings.⁴

VIDH was identified as being in need of assistance for two consecutive years based on the State's FFY 2009 and FFY 2010 APRs. VIDH was required to report, with the FFY 2011 APR, on: (1) the technical assistance sources from which VIDH received assistance; and (2) the actions VIDH took as a result of that technical assistance. The State reported on the technical assistance sources from which the State received assistance for this indicator and reported on the actions the State took as a result of that technical assistance.

Special Conditions: The timely service provision requirements and the related requirements regarding timely payment of early intervention service (EIS) providers are the subject of Special Conditions attached to VIDH's FFY 2012 IDEA Part C Grant Award letter, dated July 1, 2012. VIDH's IDEA Part C grant has been subject to these Special Conditions since FFY 2001. These FFY 2012 Special Conditions require VIDH to continue using its third party agent to timely pay its EIS providers to ensure the uninterrupted provision of early intervention services to infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families. The FFY 2012 Special Conditions required VIDH to provide a progress report with the FFY 2011 APR due February 15, 2013. VIDH provided the required information. OSEP will respond to VIDH's final progress report, due May 1, 2013, in the VIDH's FFY 2013 IDEA Part C Grant Award letter.

REQUIRED ACTIONS

Because VIDH reported less than 100% compliance for FFY 2011, the VIDH must report on the status of correction of noncompliance identified in FFY 2011 for this indicator. When reporting on the correction of noncompliance, VIDH must report, in its FFY 2012 APR, that it has verified that each EIS program or provider with noncompliance identified in FFY 2011 for this indicator: (1) is correctly implementing the specific regulatory requirements (i.e., achieved 100% compliance) based on a review of updated data such as data subsequently collected through on-site monitoring or a State data system; and (2) has corrected each individual case of noncompliance, unless the child is no longer within the jurisdiction of the EIS program or provider, consistent with OSEP Memo 09-02. In the FFY 2012 APR, VIDH must describe the specific actions that were taken to verify the correction.

INDICATOR 7:

VIDH reported that it did not identify any findings of noncompliance in FFY 2010 for this indicator, and explained that VIDH did not identify any findings of noncompliance based on the seven instances of noncompliance reflected in the FFY 2010 data, because it verified correction of all of those instances of noncompliance, in a manner consistent with OSEP Memo 09-02, prior to the issuance of findings.

REQUIRED ACTIONS

Because VIDH reported less than 100% compliance for FFY 2011, VIDH must report on the status of correction of noncompliance identified in FFY 2011 for this indicator. The State reported on the technical assistance sources from which the State received assistance for this indicator and reported on the actions the State took as a result of that technical assistance.

INDICATOR 9: Although the FFY 2010 data for Indicators 1, 7, and 8C reflected noncompliance, VIDH reported that it did not issue any findings of noncompliance in FFY 2010, because VIDH verified, consistent with the requirements of OSEP Memo 09-02, correction of the FFY 2010 noncompliance prior to the issuance of findings.

In addition, VIDH reported in the Indicator 9 Worksheet and on pages 36-40 of the FFY 2011 APR, that VIDH did not issue any findings in FFY 2010, including findings in related requirements or in areas other than the APR indicator areas.

VIDH was identified as being in need of assistance for two consecutive years based on the VIDH's FFY 2009 and FFY 2010 APRs. VIDH was required to report and did report, with its FFY 2011 APR, on: (1) the technical assistance sources from which VIDH received assistance; and (2) the actions VIDH took as a result of that technical assistance.

REQUIRED ACTIONS

When reporting in the FFY 2012 APR on the correction of findings of noncompliance, VIDH must report that it verified that each EIS program or provider with findings of noncompliance identified in FFY 2011: (1) is correctly implementing the specific regulatory requirements (i.e., achieved 100% compliance) based on a review of updated data such as data subsequently collected through on-site monitoring or a State data system; and (2) has corrected each individual case of noncompliance, unless the child is no longer within the jurisdiction of the EIS program, consistent with OSEP Memo 09-02. In the FFY 2012 APR, VIDH must describe the specific actions that were taken to verify the correction. In addition, in reporting on Indicator 9 in the FFY 2012 APR, VIDH must use and submit the Indicator 9 Worksheet.

Further, in responding to Indicator 1, 7, and 8C in the FFY 2012 APR, VIDH must report on correction of the noncompliance described in this table under those indicators.

OTHER ISSUES : Public Reporting

Because VIDH is a unitary system for SPP/APR reporting purposes (i.e., VIDH as the lead agency is also the only EIS program), VIDH's public reporting responsibilities for the SPP/APR are met by posting its SPP/APR on VIDH's Web site and distributing the SPP/APR to the media and public agencies (such as VIDH's two main districts and the EIS providers in those districts), as required by IDEA sections 616(b)(2)(C)(ii)(I) and 642 and 34 CFR §303.702(b)(1)(i)(B). VIDH has not met this public reporting requirement for its SPP/APR for FFY 2010 (July 1, 2010-June 30, 2011) and FFY 2009 (July 1, 2009-June 30, 2010). VIDH did not provide confirmation of this public reporting for its FFY 2009 APR as requested in OSEP's June 2012 FFY 2010 SPP/APR Response Table.
