I am writing in response to Wisconsin's requests to waive certain statutory and regulatory requirements of Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). After reviewing Wisconsin's requests, I am pleased to grant the following waivers:

- Approving schools and LEAs identified for improvement, corrective action, or restructuring as supplemental educational services (SES) providers. I am granting a one-year waiver of 34 C.F.R. §200.47(b)(1)(iv)(A) and (B) to permit Wisconsin to approve a school or LEA identified for improvement, corrective action, or restructuring to serve as an SES provider in the 2010–2011 school year.

This waiver is granted on the following conditions:

- Wisconsin will submit to the Department a report that provides:
 - The total number of LEAs identified for improvement or corrective action that were approved to be SES providers for the 2010–2011 school year; and
 - The total number of schools identified for improvement, corrective action, or restructuring that were approved to be SES providers for the 2010–2011 school year.
