Dear Governor Beshear:

I am writing in response to Kentucky's request to amend its approved Race to the Top grant project. Between November 2012 and July 2013, the State submitted an amendment request to the U.S. Department of Education (Department). As you are aware, the Department has the authority to approve amendments to your plan and budget, provided that such a change does not alter the scope or objectives of the approved proposal. On October 4, 2011, the Department sent a letter and revised "Grant Amendment Submission Process" document to Governors of grantee States indicating the process by which amendments would be reviewed and approved or denied. To determine whether approval could be granted, the Department has applied the conditions noted in the document, and compared it with the Race to the Top program *Principles*, which are also included in that document.

I approve the following amendments:

- Adding 2012-2013 and 2014-2015 NAEP Reading and Math targets for subgroups as these were not included in Kentucky's application (Appendix A);
- Revising 2014-2015 NAEP Reading and Math targets for "All Students" Grades 4 and 8 based on NAEP trend data. A close review and analysis of NAEP State average scores over the past several administrations and newly established subgroup targets, supported the State's rationale that NAEP targets set in the application for "All Students" needed to be revised and aligned to other State targets and goals (Appendix B); and
- Adding baseline data and SYs 2012-2013, 2013-2014, and 2014-2015 for State assessment student achievement targets and gap targets for subgroups as these were not included in Kentucky's application (Appendix C).

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The Department of Education's mission is to promote student achievement and preparation for global competitiveness by fostering educational excellence and ensuring equal access.

The Department also acknowledges the alternative ACT benchmark scores [English - 18; Math - 19; and Reading - 20] the State will use to determine "...the number of students that meet ACT college benchmarks" for college readiness.

It is our understanding that these changes to performance measures and goals are consistent with Kentucky's approved request for ESEA flexibility and represent ambitious and achievable targets that will not change the scope and objectives of the work. Please note that this letter will be posted on the Department's website as a record of the amendment.
