


Vocational Rehabilitation

The Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) program is administered by the Department of Education's Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA). VR provides education and training opportunities to individuals with disabilities to maximize their employment, independence, and integration into the community and the competitive labor market.


Almost **1 million** individuals with disabilities received services from VR¹ in 2016²

In the last fiscal year, nearly 1.4 million individuals were involved in the public VR process in 2016, including more than 972,000 individuals who were actively receiving services.


Percentage of Individuals Served by Primary Disability




33% of the individuals who exited the VR program after receiving services in 2016 had a Psychosocial or Psychological disability as their primary disabling condition.³

VR provides training services such as vocational training and tuition assistance; career services such as vocational rehabilitation counseling and job search assistance; and other services such as the provision of rehabilitation technology to individuals with disabilities


Services Provided³



Over **55 thousand** individuals under the age of 25 found employment after receiving services from VR.³



Job Placement



Nearly 57% of individuals with disabilities who received services from VR found employment. More than 64% of individuals who are blind or visually impaired found employment after receiving services from VR.³
