The State of Georgia provided stabilization funds to each LEA in the state to assist with the cost of salaries and fringe benefits for teachers and staff. Entry from previous timeframe:

The State of Georgia distributed Education Stabilization funds to the University System of Georgia and the Technical College System of Georgia, both of which provide public postsecondary education. **The University System of Georgia was awarded \$297,599,898 in stabilization funds to help offset state budget reductions in FY 2009 and FY 2010. The stabilization funds were allocated to the all 35 institutions on a pro-rata share of budget and were used solely to cover salaries and fringe benefits of faculty and staff. The funds were used to accomplish the following: • Sustain employment of faculty and staff • Meet student needs for classes so that they can progress to degree on schedule • Meet increased enrollment demand. ****The Technical College System of Georgia was awarded \$49,495,854 in stabilization funds to offset state budget reductions in FY 2009 and 2010. The funds were awarded to the system's 27 institutions to maintain payroll levels. Funds were used exclusively for salary and fringe benefits. They allowed the technical colleges to retain full-time positions that may have been eliminated or reduced to part-time status.**

Entry from previous timeframe:

The State of Georgia used Government Services funds to assist in covering salaries and fringe benefits costs associated with public safety personnel in the following agencies: Department of Corrections, Georgia Bureau of Investigations, Department of Public Safety, and the Department of Juvenile Justice. In addition, the State used stabilization funds to help cover salary and fringe benefits costs in the Tax Compliance program at the Department of Revenue. Stabilization funds in each of these agencies were used exclusively to cover salaries and fringe benefits. This assisted these departments in maintaining public safety and important general government positions during the state budget reductions of FY 2009 and FY 2010.

III.A. & B. Tuition and Fees

Describe any actions taken by the State to limit increases in tuition and fees imposed by public IHEs for in-State students:

Entry from previous timeframe:

The State of Georgia has worked to minimize budget reductions in the area of education to the extent possible, while facing sharply declining revenues and balanced budget requirements. The State does not set tuition and fee rates for the University System of Georgia or the Technical College System of Georgia. This is the responsibility of the 18 member Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia and the 21 member State Board of Technical and Adult Education, which governs the Technical College System of Georgia. **** University System of Georgia (USG): While some tuition increase has taken place at USG institutions as a result of budget shortfalls, Georgia's institutions of higher education have worked to limit this. Tuition at Georgia's two and four year public colleges and universities remains in the bottom half of Southern Regional Education Board states. The following actions have been taken by the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia in recent years with respect to tuition: • In Fiscal year 2007, the Board approved a new guaranteed tuition policy, known also as the "fixed-for-four" plan under which entering students were guaranteed a fixed tuition rate for four years at research or comprehensive state universities or three years at two-year colleges. Following state budget reductions in FY 2009 this tuition plan was discontinued for FY 2010. However, the guarantee will be honored for those students who entered under this policy. • Recognizing that it takes 15 hours per semester in order for a student to graduate in four years, the new full-time rate for new students entering in FY 2010 has been set at 15 hours rather than at 12 hours per semester. The credit hour rate has been frozen at the FY 2009 level. • A new "Finish-in-Four" Tuition Model has been established at the University of Georgia and Georgia Institute of Technology where demand for admission greatly exceeds availability. This is to encourage students to take the full-time load and graduate in four years. The new tuition model is a flat rate of \$3,035 per semester for FY 2010 for all students who take in excess of six hours. Students enrolled in 6 hours or fewer will pay a flat rate of \$1,800 per semester. **** Technical College System of Georgia: The Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) has worked to keep attendance costs low even as enrollment has increased significantly. To the greatest extent possible, TCSG has worked to achieve operating efficiencies to reduce expenses, such as consolidating facilities and using a greater share of part-time faculty to meet increased demand. Required fees have been held flat at most institutions. While tuition costs have risen, this has generally been the result of preparations for a quarter to semester system conversion, which is planned for fall 2011. PLEASE NOTE: Data below reflect that Valdosta Technical Institute and East Central Technical Institute merged on July 1, 2010 to become Wiregrass Technical Institute (which now uses the same IPEDS number as Valdosta Technical Institute used formerly).

VI. Progress in Advancing Education Reform

A. Reducing inequities in the distribution of highly qualified teachers:

Describe the steps that the State has taken, from October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011, to reduce inequities in the distribution of highly qualified teachers.

Entry from previous timeframe:

Steps to reduce inequities in the distribution of highly qualified teachers include:

- **Monitoring:** Staff monitored LEA compliance with all Title II, Part A state and federal requirements, including equitable distribution of highly qualified teachers. Monitoring reviews include preparing for, scheduling, and conducting visits with assigned school systems to ensure Title II, Part A compliance with state and federal guidelines and making recommendations for areas for improvement where needed; maintaining accurate and complete records for Title II, Part A documentation; communicating periodically and as needed with assigned school system and school personnel regarding monitoring requirements and progress; and reporting monitoring results and progress to the assigned school systems and schools as appropriate. Each year approximately one-third of Georgia's school systems are monitored by Title II, Part A staff or when there is a new Title II, Part A LEA Coordinator. In addition, staff monitors systems determined to be 2141c.
- **Technical Assistance:** Staff provided Title II, Part A technical assistance and consultation to school systems, including preparations for 2141c and regular monitoring, with a focus on ensuring highly qualified teachers and paraprofessionals and achieving equity in schools.
- **2010 Handbook:** Staff revised the Georgia Implementation Guidelines, the No Child

Staff revised the Georgia Implementation Guidelines, the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, Title II, Part A, Criteria for Highly Qualified Teachers, the authoritative document designed to guide LEAs in their efforts to implement the Title II, Part A program requirements. A special focus was placed on Section II: Highly Qualified Guidelines, Section V. Compliance, and a new section was developed, Section VII. Planning for Equity, that holds a revised LEA Equity Plan Checklist.

- Data: Staff maintained reporting systems, including HiQ2; produced Teacher Quality reports; provided data analysis services; and conducted research studies where needed to support Georgia's Title II, Part A efforts. This includes collecting, producing, and providing status data and includes the following:
 - o Equity Technical Assistance (ETA) Website Data: * Summarizes school level, system level, and state level data combining key variables from the Certified Personal Information (CPI), the Highly Qualified data system (HiQ2), the Full-Time Equivalent records (FTE), the Student Record (SR), the Student Course Profile (CR), the Annual Yearly Progress report (AYP), and the teacher certification records for both Georgia teacher certificates as well as National Board Certificate information and the Master Teacher records; * Compares and contrasts schools within a system and across the state; * Provides important indicators of teacher population; * Provides longitudinal data on all schools; * Provides experience continuity ratios.
 - o HiQ Data: All LEAs received summary data by school and by system for highly qualified teachers (FTE) by subject area for FY10. All systems were required to complete the "Title I, Part A and Title II, Part A Section 1119 Qualifications for Teachers and Paraprofessionals Verification of Compliance – Principal Attestations and Assurances" required of principals, along with the "System and School Data Review Statement" required of superintendents. The Principal Attestations and Assurances form assures that the provisions of Section 1119 are met in each school; or that a highly qualified teacher was not available for hire and placement in a given position; or the best candidate was hired and placed in a given position; and that a remediation plan was developed for each non-HiQ teacher according to the guidelines.
 - o Project EQ: Georgia refined its online, intra-state resource in which school systems can report and share, in a collaborative setting, best practices used in their districts for equitable distribution, especially for poor and minority students. In Summer 2010, all LEAs were required to upload their equity plans, including evidence of success and summary of impact into Project EQ. These data are made available to schools systems to help further their work in equity. Georgia's work with equity and Project EQ was one of three states featured in the National Comprehensive Center for Teacher Quality's policy publication.
 - o HiQ2: HiQ2 is an online educator inventory system designed to assist school systems in determining if an educator meets the federal definition of "highly qualified" when placed in a particular teaching assignment. This system is also used to gather data to report to USDOE and to use to help determine AYP. HiQ2 is key in helping to ensure equitable distribution of highly qualified teachers.
 - o Monitoring Summary of Results: The GaPSC summarizes results of each monitoring requirement.
 - o Tracking of: * CLIP Reviews; * Budget and Amendment Reviews; * Superintendent Data Review Statement; * Section 2141 Reviews.
 - o Statewide Meeting Feedback Survey Results: Used to guide program improvement.
- Professional Development Activities: Staff hosted several conferences and made multiple presentations at local, regional, state, and national professional development events on teacher quality and equitable distribution.
- o Staff collaborated in planning, developing, and delivering the Fall "2010 Title II, Part A LEA Coordinators' Meeting," which was focused on achieving 100% highly qualified and included sessions on equity.
- o Virtual state-wide equity training sessions were conducted for the first time to assist LEAs in understanding Title II, Part A equity requirements and to assist them in developing school system equity plans.
- o Staff collaborated in the planning, developing, and delivering of the Spring "2010 Advancing Teacher Quality in Georgia" Annual Meeting, in which one day focused specifically on the study of equity in schools, including how to examine and enhance equity plans and put equity into action.

- All LEA FY10 Equity Plans were approved by Title II, Part A staff.
- Charter Systems and Schools: A diverse, representative Charter

School Advisory Board was developed to examine issues around charter schools and Title II, Part A. The resulting product was a more clearly articulated Charter School Guidance for Title II, Part A to ensure highly qualified teachers. • Staff revised Georgia’s Statewide Equity Plan, “Reaching and Maintaining the Goal of 100% Highly Qualified Teachers and Providing Equitable Opportunities for All Students.” The plan was published on the Title II, Part A Website at www.gapsc.com
