The funds accounted for approximately 17% of the State's primary wealth equalized state school aid category called Equalization Aid. The funds were used to support all educational programs normally supported by Equalization Aid in the General Fund. These programs include Regular and Special Education Programs, Child Study Teams, Speech Services, Basic Skills, Bilingual Education, Vocational Programs, Health Services, Guidance, School Libraries, Transportation, etc... Without these funds, school districts would have made severe cuts in their programs and raised local levies. The funds were used to support all educational programs normally supported by Equalization Aid in the General Fund. These programs include Regular and Special Education Programs, Child Study Teams, Speech Services, Basic Skills, Bilingual Education, Vocational Programs, Health Services, Guidance, School Libraries, Transportation, etc... These funds combined with Education Service funds allowed school districts to continue their education programs and avoid corresponding tax levy increases. All public IHEs received Government Services funds (GSF) through Tuition Assistance Grants (TAG). All GSF received for TAG were utilized by the IHEs only for salaries. As a result of receiving these GSF for salaries, IHEs were able to mitigate in-state tuition and fee increases, to create and/or retain jobs, to support enrollment growth at the institutions, and to further the public service mission of the IHEs. The Department of Corrections also used all GSF for salaries. As a result of receiving these GSF for salaries, the State of New Jersey was able to prevent layoffs in other state departments.**

All public IHEs were required to certify, through an application, the institution's increase in its in-state undergraduate 2009-10 tuition rates and required educational and general fees did not exceed 3% above the institution's in-state undergraduate 2008-09 tuition rates and required fees. Additionally, the public IHEs also had to implement some of the cost-saving measures that were adopted at the state level. In order to enforce the requirements, the following two pieces of budget language was added to the FY 2010 Appropriations Act: "The senior public institutions of higher education having expressed a commitment to limit tuition increases, the amounts hereinabove appropriated from federal economic stimulus funds for senior public institutions of higher education shall be withheld until the institution certifies to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury that the institution's increase in its in-state undergraduate 2009-10 tuition rates and required educational and general fees does not exceed 3% above the institution's in-state undergraduate 2008-09 tuition rates and required fees. In the event that any institution cannot certify its compliance with this condition to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury by December 1, 2009, the appropriation withheld shall be reallocated to other public institutions of higher education by the State Treasurer based upon the recommendations of the Commission on Higher Education and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury." "Of the amounts hereinabove appropriated for senior public institutions of higher education, an amount up to 5.25% of the appropriation for each senior public institution of higher education shall be withheld until the institution certifies to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury that the institution has: 1) achieved or will achieve personnel related cost savings through wage freezes, furloughs, or other actions that provide savings equivalent to Fiscal Year 2010 savings that the negotiated self-directed furlough program for civilian State employees will achieve; 2) adopted travel policies that comply with executive branch travel restrictions for travel that is funded by State operating appropriations; 3) maintained institutional funding for Educational Opportunity Fund programs at the fiscal year 2009 levels; and 4) maintained institutional funding for the Education of Language Minority Students (ELMS) at the fiscal year 2009 levels. In the event that any institution cannot certify its compliance with this condition to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury by December 1, 2009, the appropriation withheld from that institution shall be reallocated to other public institutions of higher education by the State Treasurer based upon the recommendations of the Commission on Higher Education and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury."

**During the period of award the State underwent a change of administration in the Governor's Office. The prior administration appropriated all SFSF funds in state fiscal year 2010(ending June 30,2010). Given the change of Governor's, effective January,2010, it is not possible to estimate the degree to which tax increases were averted in state fiscal year 2010 by the prior administration because of the availability of SFSF funds. Since SFSF funds were not available for use in state fiscal year 2011, the current administration undertook significant budget reductions in February,2010, and again in July,2010, as opposed to implementing tax increases to maintain funding levels supported with SFSF funds.**

#### VI. Progress in Advancing Education Reform

##### A. Reducing inequities in the distribution of highly qualified teachers:

Describe the steps that the State has taken, from October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011, to reduce inequities in the distribution of highly qualified teachers.

Entry from previous timeframe:

All school districts annually identify the highly qualified status of every teacher in the State's Certificated Staff Report. Using this collection, the department analyzes multiple data variables to inform targeted interventions for school districts. For example, those districts that did not achieve the annual measurable objective (AMO) of 100% of classes taught by highly qualified teachers for two consecutive years must submit a Highly Qualified Teacher (HQT) Improvement Plan. In 2009 there were 42 districts on this list; this number was reduced to 16 districts in 2010. Also, three districts designated "districts in need of improvement" that missed the AMO for three consecutive years, both in 2009 and 2010, are implementing an NCLB collaborative agreement on the use of Title II funds to support the State's equity goals. The NJDOE employs intensive support and accountability measures in these districts, resulting in a reduction in the number of teachers who are not highly qualified in their teaching assignments and increased strategies to ensure equitable distribution of highly qualified teachers. In addition, the HQT coordinator identifies districts that may have inaccuracies in their reporting and conducts targeted audits of HQT records. As a result of these audits, district recordkeeping and accountability around HQT compliance have improved. New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum (NJQSAC), New Jersey's school district evaluation system, specifically addresses district compliance with the provisions of the highly qualified teacher requirements as well as licensure, mentoring, and professional development. The HQT coordinator consults with State monitors and district personnel as a member of NJQSAC teams in specific districts where equitable distribution of highly qualified teachers may be compromised. Further, in 2010 there has been progress in the implementation of research-based professional development policies that support teacher effectiveness in New Jersey's schools. For example, the number of districts creating and nurturing professional learning communities (PLCs) to support effective instruction is expanding. The NJDOE has conducted a formal evaluation of 33 schools in various stages of PLC development, which revealed that our efforts are paying off in these school districts. Also, many districts are reporting anecdotally that the State's new professional development planning process, implemented in 2010-2011, is advancing best practices in classrooms by encouraging teachers to support one another professionally. Finally, in 2010 the NJDOE established a council of colleges, school districts and professional organizations—the Partnership for Collaborative Professional Learning—charged with communicating a common message to the field. From all reports, this State-led collaboration is already having a positive impact on collaborative school cultures, contributing to the erosion of inequities in teaching and learning in New Jersey.
