Entry from previous timeframe:

The \$26.5 million Education Stabilization funds awarded to the New Mexico public institutions of higher education represent 4.4% of total state appropriations for Instruction and General (I&G) purposes. State appropriations were reduced by 11.6% (\$80 million) since FY 2008-09 and thus, the federal grants provided timely budgetary relief. The Governor restricted the use of Education Stabilization funds to I&G purposes as defined in the state's financial reporting manual for higher education. Those functional areas consist of instruction, academic support, student services, institutional support, and operation/maintenance of plant. Through the reporting period of September 30, 2010, \$1.5 million had been spent. Sixty-six percent was used for faculty and staff compensation and 34% for other purposes, primarily utilities. IHEs reported that 174 full-time equivalent positions were "saved" with the help of the federal money.

The state of New Mexico allocated \$55,515,100 or around 96% of the Government Services Fund (GSF) as of 9-30-10. Of this total, public safety projects and services comprised over 41% (\$22,935,000) of the allotted GSF funds to: replace old self rescue breathing units for Albuquerque firefighters, construct a new fire station for the fast growing town of Rio Rancho and cover budget shortfalls for operating and programs costs for the Department of Corrections and Department of Public Safety. The Public Education Department (PED) received \$8,400,000 in GSF funds for the Graduate New Mexico initiative to: bring back 10,000 dropouts to earn their high school diploma, address the achievement gap and improve graduation rates in New Mexico. In addition, the state allotted \$3,891,000 to PED and the Higher Education Department primarily to: cover budget shortfalls in teacher benefits, training and educational programs; and to modernize educational facilities. The state's Human Services Department, Veteran Services Department and Children Youth and Families Department received \$6,334,000 in public assistance to cover budget shortfalls or provide services in general assistance, veterans' wellness, homeless children & at risk newborns, food security and child crisis center programs. Ten state agencies received a total of \$1,988,100 in GSF funds to cover budget shortfalls to prevent: furloughs of departmental and judiciary employees and/or further cuts in programs and services. The state allocated a total of \$1,423,500 in GSF funds to three water projects to: partially support construction of a large metropolitan drinking water system and a tribal wetlands project and to fully fund six acequia projects in economically distressed New Mexican communities. The state allotted \$643,500 in GSF funds to prevent cutbacks or elimination of Sunday rail service for the RailRunner train. The New Mexico Office of Recovery and Reinvestment was allocated \$1,150,000 to provide administrative, compliance and fiscal oversight of the American Recovery and Investment Act (ARRA) funds for FY10 and FY11. The Department of Cultural Affairs received \$1,750,000 in GSF funds to upgrade its Los Luceros historical property into a film education center for New Mexicans.
