The Education Service Fund (ESF) awarded to Texas by the USDE totals \$3,250,272,133, which was appropriated by the Texas Legislature in Article XII of Senate Bill 1 for the 2010-2011 biennium. The Texas Education Agency (TEA) has been designated to administer and monitor ESF. In accordance with the ARRA, the amount of ESF provided to each district was determined by the State's school funding formulas. ARRA and April 2009 guidance from USDE on the ESF program specified:

- LEAs have complete discretion in determining how ESF should be utilized so long as funds are spent consistent with federal law as detailed in Section 14003 of ARRA: <http://www2.ed.gov/policy/gen/leg/recovery/statutory/stabilization-fund.pdf>.
- The State cannot direct how an LEA uses its ESF.

Therefore, in accordance with ARRA, LEAs determined how best to utilize their ESF. To assist LEAs in determining how to spend funds, TEA:

- Required LEAs to submit an application to TEA demonstrating plans to use funds toward allowable expenses and abide by all federal standards and requirements;
- In accordance with ARRA, encouraged LEAs to utilize ESF in the four specific reform areas stated in ARRA Section 14005, including: 1. Achieving equity in teacher distribution; 2. Improving collection and use of data; 3. Enhancing the quality of standards and assessments; and 4. Supporting struggling schools.
- Encouraged LEAs to utilize the funds in the four ARRA reform areas, in part, by creating the "Texas Steps Up" program that gave LEAs incentive to spend ESF on programs that would improve student achievement; and
- In accordance with USDE guidance, informed LEAs to invest ARRA funds in one-time expenses to minimize the "funding cliff" along with other principles (see Section I-4 of <http://www2.ed.gov/programs/statestabilization/guidance.doc>, page 2).

Further, Governor Perry signed Executive Orders RP 70 and RP 72, which can be viewed at: <http://governor.state.tx.us/news/executive-order/13293/> and <http://governor.state.tx.us/news/executive-order/13543/>. The executive orders directed all State agencies and IHEs that engage in the management and administration of ARRA funds to develop strategies that maximize the use of ARRA funds without creating ongoing expenses to the State or localities after stimulus funds expire. In order to identify how LEAs chose to use and the impact of ESF for this report, TEA conducted a survey of LEAs. Per the survey, at least 71%, or 874 of 1,228 LEAs reported using some or all of their ESF toward advancing the four education reforms recommended by ARRA and USDE. The LEAs use and impact of the funds are described below:

1. Making improvements in teacher effectiveness:
  - Use: Approximately 71% of LEAs (874 out of 1,228) reported that ESF were spent toward making improvements in teacher effectiveness and in the equitable distribution of qualified teachers for all students, particularly students who are most in need. The top five activities these LEAs reported using funds for under this reform include payroll for elementary/intermediate school salaries, payroll for high school salaries, payroll for junior high/middle school salaries, expanding/adding new systems/technology (smart boards, Computers on Wheels, etc.) and technology for students.
  - Impact: Of the 1,228 LEAs, approximately 40% reported ESF had an impact on raising student performance on the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS). Approximately 28% indicated ESF had an impact on retaining highly qualified teachers; approximately 24% indicated ESF had an impact on expanding technology available to students; and approximately 16% indicated ESF had an impact on aligning curriculum.
2. Establishing pre-K-to-college and career data systems that track progress and foster continuous improvement:
  - Use: Approximately 29% of LEAs (359 out of 1,228) reported that ESF were spent toward establishing pre-K-to-college and career data systems that track progress and foster continuous improvement. The top five activities these LEAs reported using funds for under this reform include funds for student data tracking systems, software, upgrading existing technology, payroll for elementary/intermediate school salaries, and payroll for high school salaries.
  - Impact: Of the 1,228 LEAs, approximately 15% reported ESF had an impact on raising student performance on TAKS. Approximately 11% indicated ESF had an impact on expanding technology available to students;

approximately 9% indicated ESF had an impact on targeted instruction via student data systems; and approximately 7% indicated ESF had an impact on retaining highly qualified teachers. 3. Making progress toward rigorous college- and career-ready standards and high quality assessments: • Use: Approximately 48% of LEAs (586 out of 1,228) reported that ESF were spent making progress toward rigorous college- and career-ready standards and high quality assessments that are valid and reliable for all students, including English language learners and students with disabilities. The top five activities these LEAs reported using funds for under this reform include payroll for high school salaries, payroll for elementary/intermediate salaries, technology for students, payroll for junior high/middle school salaries, and expanding/adding new systems/technology (smart boards, Computers on Wheels, etc.). • Impact: Of the 1,228 LEAs, approximately 26% reported ESF had an impact on raising student performance on TAKS. Approximately 18% indicated ESF had an impact on expanding technology available to students; approximately 13% indicated ESF had an impact on retaining highly qualified teachers; and approximately 11% indicated ESF had an impact on aligning curriculum. 4. Providing intensive support and effective interventions for the lowest-performing schools: • Use: Approximately 33% of LEAs (409 out of 1,228) reported that ESF were spent toward providing intensive support and effective interventions for the lowest-performing schools. The top five activities these LEAs reported using funds for under this reform include payroll for high school salaries, payroll for elementary/intermediate school salaries, upgrading existing technology, payroll for junior high/middle school salaries, and technology for students. • Impact: Of the 1,228 LEAs, approximately 19% reported ESF had an impact on raising student performance on TAKS. Approximately 11% indicated ESF had an impact on expanding technology available to students; approximately 9% indicated ESF had an impact on providing a safe learning environment; and approximately 9% indicated ESF had an impact on aligning curriculum. In addition to the four ARRA reform areas, schools reported utilizing ESF toward providing a safe learning environment through activities related to payroll, technology, instructional materials, and utilities. TEA has monitored LEAs throughout Texas to help ensure they are spending ESF in accordance with ARRA. TEA's ESF monitoring plans, including desk reviews, on-site visit, audits, and monitoring reviews, have been approved by USDE and are being conducted to ensure compliance with ARRA transparency and accountability requirements. **All \$3.25 billion of SFSF funds awarded to Texas were allocated to school districts prior to September 30, 2010 and reported as "made available" in the Initial SFSF Annual Performance Report (APR) pursuant to USDE instructions. However, not all money allocated in Federal Fiscal Year 2010 was expended in FFY 2010, resulting in \$1,681,092,531.98 of FFY 2010 allocations being expended in FFY 2011. Pursuant to USDE instructions, Section 1A of this report shows all zeros in 2011 to avoid double counting the portion of 2010 allocations actually expended in 2011. There were no new allocations in 2011 because all the funds were originally allocated prior to September 30, 2010. LEAs generally used remaining ESF funds toward similar expenditures in the second year of the SFSF Program as reported in the first year and achieved similar results. Because of onerous federal requirements for infrastructure projects, over the course of the SFSF grant period, some LEAs chose to remove these types of projects from their SFSF**

grants via amendments and adjusting journal entries, making corrections as needed to their 1512 reports. TEA's estimates of infrastructure expenditures for both the Initial APR and the Final APR were based on LEA 1512 reports. Because of the repurposing of funds described earlier, in the SFSF 1512 Quarterly Report for the quarter ending September 30, 2011, LEAs reported infrastructure expenditures of \$15,055,056.18, which is \$10,039,385.15 less than the previous year's reported expenditures. Some of these LEA decisions affect the estimated draw downs for "contracts for construction, modernization, renovation, and repair projects" as reported in Texas' Initial APR. However, the SFSF APR reporting system does not allow for an adjustment to the initial report. If the -\$10,039,385.15 is not fully accounted for, the total of the amounts in the categories of expenses for the Initial and Final SFSF APRs would exceed the grand total actually drawn down by the State on behalf of LEAs, which is prohibited by the instructions for question II.A.2 in both the Initial and Final SFSF APRs. Therefore, the effect of the LEAs' removal of infrastructure projects must be applied to the Final SFSF APR estimate of draw downs for "contracts for construction, modernization, renovation, and repair." The SFSF APR reporting system, however, will not allow a negative number to be entered in question II.A.2, so TEA has entered \$0 and applied the -\$10,039,385.15 to the "Other" category. **The Government Services Fund (GSF) award to the State of Texas by USDE totals \$723,165,683, which was appropriated by the Texas Legislature in Article XII of Senate Bill 1 of the General Appropriations Act for the 2010-2011 biennium. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) has been designated administrative responsibility to manage the ARRA State Fiscal Stabilization – Government Services Fund. A summary of the general use and affect of GSF funding is provided below: • \$362 million was appropriated by the legislature to be used for the purchase of elementary and secondary textbooks. • \$147 million was appropriated by the legislature to be used to provide formula funding for public general academic and health-related IHEs and community colleges. Formula funding is provided based on enrollment data. Formula appropriations are intended to support general operations such as faculty and staff salaries, equipment, information technology, and scholarships. • \$80 million was appropriated by the legislature to be used for incentive funding to general academic IHEs. Incentive funding is provided based on the institutions' meeting specific degree objectives. Incentive appropriations are intended to support general operations such as faculty and staff salaries, equipment, information technology, and scholarships. • \$100 million was appropriated by the legislature for special projects at several public general academic and health-related IHEs. Special project funding was appropriated by the legislature to support rural health and medicine programs, workforce training for economic and community development, expansion of undergraduate programs and studies, environmental research and outreach programs to attract high school students to university science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) studies. • \$34 million was appropriated by the legislature to support several statewide programs, including programs supporting economic development, cultural arts, health services, environment, and for the administration of GSF and ARRA funding. **The GSF award to the State of Texas by the U.S. Department of Education totals \$723,165,683, which was appropriated by the Texas Legislature in Article XII of SB1, of the GAA for the 2010-2011 biennium. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) has been designated administrative responsibility to manage the GSF. GSF funds have been used for the purchase of public education textbooks, to support universities and community colleges through general and incentive funding and special projects which supported rural health and medicine programs, workforce training for economic and community development, expansion of undergraduate programs and studies, environmental research, and outreach programs to attract high school students to university science, technical, engineering and math (STEM) studies. Additional funds were appropriated to statewide programs supporting economic development, cultural arts, health services, environment, and the administration of ARRA funding. Describe any actions taken by the State to limit increases in tuition and fees imposed by public IHEs for in-State students:

Entry from previous timeframe:

**Governor Perry issued Executive Order RP 73 on September 9, 2009, calling for a review of cost efficiencies at IHEs. See the executive order at: <http://governor.state.tx.us/news/executive-order/13573/>. As a result of the executive order, the THECB delivered a report to the governor and legislature in November 2010 detailing higher education cost efficiencies and recommended a series of strategies that would save \$4.5 billion over four years when fully implemented. See the summary of the report at: <http://www.thecb.state.tx.us/download.cfm?downloadfile=B8BFC12D-9A29-5FE9-28CF6CE817DF6EA8&typename=dmFile&fieldname=filename>. Many of the recommendations can be implemented by Texas IHEs without legislative action, and IHEs are being encouraged to do so. If operational costs at IHEs decrease, the need for tuition increases should decrease as well. During the 81st Legislative Session in 2009, the Texas House of Representatives passed House Concurrent Resolution (HCR) 288 directing general academic institutions to limit increases in total academic costs charged to resident undergraduate students. The HCR sent a strong message to institutions, resulting in a majority of them staying within the parameters of HCR 288 and not raising tuition more than the 3.95 percent (or \$280) per academic year described in the resolution. Looking forward, the governor has proposed a four-year tuition freeze that would lock in tuition rates for four years after the student enters a State university. Additionally, in February 2011, the governor issued a challenge to the Board of Regents at each State university to develop a degree plan for \$10,000—including textbooks—in order to make college more affordable.**

**On May 14, 2012, Governor Perry, in a letter to Fred Heldenfels, chair of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB), asked THECB to follow-**

**up with institutions of higher education and report back to him on the progress that institutions have made in implementing recommendations that were made by the Cost Efficiencies Committee. The Cost Efficiencies Committee was formed as a result of Executive Order RP-73, as reported in the last reporting period. See Governor's letter at: <http://www.theccb.state.tx.us/reports/pdf/2637.pdf?CFID=28841706&CFTOKEN=71622947>. In the 82nd session of the Legislature, House Bill 2999 was passed. This legislation amends the Education Code to authorize a general academic teaching institution to develop a fixed tuition rate program for qualified students who agree to transfer to the institution within 12 months after successfully earning an associate degree at a lower-division institution of higher education. This legislation was signed by the Governor on June 17, 2011 and went into effect immediately.**

#### IV. Tax Increases Averted

Estimate the degree to which State tax increases were averted because of the availability of SFSF funds.

Entry from previous timeframe:

**The State would not have raised taxes in the absence of SFSF. Texas is grounded in sound fiscal policy as the Texas Constitution requires the State to have a balanced budget. Texas also has a long history of supporting public education. From 2000 to 2009, spending on public education has increased by 82%, or \$11 billion. State fiscal policies are rooted in the belief that government must live within its means and must not place unnecessary taxes on its citizens and employers. Governor Perry signed Executive Orders RP 70 and RP 72, which can be viewed at <http://governor.state.tx.us/news/executive-order/13293/> and <http://governor.state.tx.us/news/executive-order/13543/>. Through the executive orders, the governor has charged State agencies with assuring these funds are used for one-time funding to avoid potential funding cliffs that other States may face. Without SFSF funds, Texas would have continued to operate within a balanced budget, meeting its commitment to public education without placing additional burdens on hardworking Texans through taxation.**

LEAs are evaluated for meeting the highly qualified teachers requirements each year.
