The Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA) acknowledges your electronic submission of the State Plan for the Title I Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) Services Program and Supplement for the Title VI-B Supported Employment (SE) Services Program in the form of a preprint of affirmative assurances and required attachments on behalf of the Hawaii Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) in compliance with Sections 101(a) and 625 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (the Act).
